MANUSCRIPT REVIEWER

Currently review for three professional journals – two are international peer reviewed and one is a regional peer reviewed journal. These include research journals and practitioner journals (one has a readership of ~ 30,000 and the other ~16,000). Additionally, in the past I have been a reviewer for an additional two national peer reviewed journal.

PARTICIPATION AT PROFESSIONAL MEETINGS

These include eleven international, six national, six regional, six state, and five local presentations over the past three years.

Include two presentations in Ethiopia, 20+ district wide presentations providing technical assistance to Babies Can't Wait personnel (Georgia's early intervention program), and a variety of local presentations.

To date, I have served on 11 Ph.D. committees (chair for one), one Ed.D., two Ed.S. (chair for one), and eight master's degree committees.

GRANTS AND CONTRACTS

For 2007 to 2009 I served as PI on a federal flow-through state grant worth \$167,000 and Co-PI in 2006 for \$188,000 (total of \$1.15 million since 2003). I've helped write and participate in a further six grants that range from faculty development grants of \$500 to \$600,000 district level grants, and an international grant from US Aid for International Development to develop programs in Ethiopia for \$200,000. Unfunded grants number seven.

COURSES TAUGHT

I have taught fifteen different courses that range in variety from a 100 percent on-line junior level course, to developing and teaching two off-campus preschool endorsement classes, and a doctoral research analysis class. I have developed nine of these courses.
